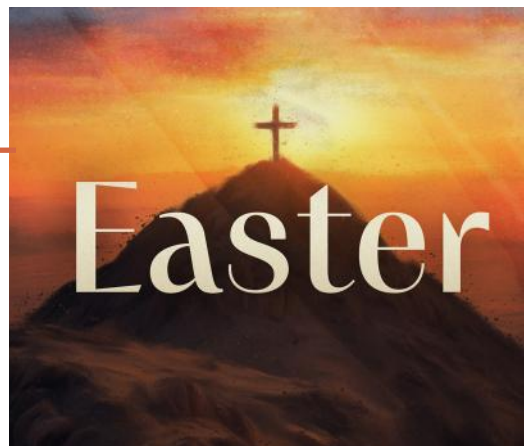


(The Spirit Who Lives—Romans 8:11-27)
